SM:"In lovely weather the above match-the first played by either club this season-was decided on the ground of the former club(i.e. Wanderers) at Kennington Oval on Saturday last, in the presence of a large number of spectators, the popularity of this winter game being evidently on the increase, from the interest shown by the onlookers on this occasion. The Wanderers won the choice of ends, and were slightly aided by the wind, the play on both sides being very even, so much so that for the first thirty-seven minutes no advantage was scored by either side, several good runs of the Rovers being only frustrated by the good back play of Hogg on the side of the Wanderers. On the other side the goal of the Clapham men was twice in danger, once through a brilliant run by Alcock of nearly half the length of the ground, the ball passing about a foot to the side of the post. On changing ends at half time the Rovers got a little the best of the game, as their forward play was first-rate, and the ball being well brought up by Holden and Watney, a scrummage in front of the goal ensued, the result of which was that C.C.Bryden(F:"...who had extricated the ball from a general scrimmage in front of the Wanderers' posts") had the good fortune to land the leather safely between the posts, just underneath the tape. After an interval of a couple of minutes the ball was again put in motion, and the Wanderers worked very hard to place themselves on an equality with their adversaries, but without success, as when time was called the Clapham Rovers were declared the winners by one goal to none. For the home team Alcock and Baker forward, and Hogg back, played quite up to their form of previous years; and of the victors, Holden, C.C. Bryden, and Watney forward, and +Dunstable back, rendered good service for their side. Morten too, deserves special mention for the excellent manner in which he kept goal."+Dimsdale

SM:"The first match of the season between these old opponents was played at the Oval on Saturday last, and ended, after a good game, in a victory for the former by one goal to none. Shortly after half - three o'clock the ball was kicked off by the captain of the Wanderers, who, having lost the toss, was reduced to occupy the goal at the Clayton Arms end of the ground, thereby receiving the disadvantage of facing both wind and sun. For a few minutes the desperate rushes of the Clapham team enabled them to keep the ball in the neighbourhood of the Wanderers' lines, but their advantage was only of a very brief duration, and they were steadily driven back and compelled to maintain a strictly defensive attitude, until at last , after about half an hour's play, a very clever run by E. Hall effected a reduction of their goal a +few minutes before the time agreed on for changing ends. After the alteration of positions , despite that the forward play of the C.C.C. was most energetic, and at times of a very creditable character, the Wanderers had all the best of the game, although when play ceased, a few minutes before five o'clock, fortune had not favoured them so far as to place any further score to their account."

SM:"These clubs met for the first time this season at the Oval yesterday(Wednesday),when,after a very pleasant and evenly-contested game, the Wanderers proved victorious by one goal to none. At about a quarter-past three o'clock play commenced with a kick off from the Service, the Wanderers occupying the western goal, with a strong wind at their backs. During the earlier part of the game the Wanderers, so far favoured with the wind, were enabled to keep the ball entirely in the territory of the Civil Service, but all their efforts and attempts at dribbling were frustrated by the frequent gusts , and when half time had expired no success had fallen to either party. Ends were consequently changed, and the Wanderers, despite that they were now in turn faced by the wind, at once drove the ball up to the vicinity of the Civil Service, which ultimately fell to C.W.Alcock, after a short run along the upper side of the ground. The renewal of hostilities was attended with little change in the aspect of affairs, and although the Wanderers maintained a slight advantage throughout, when time was called at a quarter to five o'clock, no further result had been obtained, a goal obtained by C.L.Huggins for the Wanderers being disallowed on the ground that the ball had not been allowed to reach the ground when thrown in from touch at the commencement of the run."

SM:"This match took place at the Oval on Saturday last, and as is always the case on the occasion of a meeting between two such powerful bodies, produced an interesting game, one goal to the Wanderers –which, in consequence of an objection on the part of the opposition, was ultimately conceded-forming the only result achieved by either party at the conclusion of the game. At a quarter past three o'clock, the Wanderers having won the toss (F:"electing to occupy the western goal"), and thereby derived a trifling advantage in having the sun at their backs, the ball was kicked off by West Kent, and in the first rush carried up to the Wanderers' territory. Therein, however, it remained only for a moment, as it was at once borne back into neutral ground, and in this position it chiefly rested until, after a short scrimmage a few yards in front of the Kentish posts, a "curly drop" kick by C.W. Alcock carried it between the posts. To this success, after the lapse of a few minutes, the

captain of West Kent lodged an objection on the ground that the ball had been handled, and in the face of this plea the Wanderers conceded what was certainly a just claim. At half time no further advantage had fallen to either side, and even during the latter portion of the game neither was able to achieve any decisive success, though once or twice the Wanderers drove the ball almost into the heart of the enemy's goal. Thus, at a quarter to five o'clock, when time was called, the match terminated in a draw, the goal above recorded to the Wanderers forming the only tangible score obtained by either club during the game. The new rule enforcing the abolition of handling was strictly enforced throughout, and, with the exception of an occasional relapse into the old system, worked extremely well."

F:"On several occasions the Kentish goal was placed in serious danger by the runs of R.S.Vidal, T.C.Hooman, and C.L.Huggins; but in each case it was rescued from these attacks, a result chiefly due to the excellent back play and accuracy of kicking displayed by E.L.Corrie and E.Lubbock."

SM:"Owing to the heavy rain which fell early in the afternoon,only seven of the strangers put in an appearance(F:"having been reinforced by four of the Carthusians"),and those not till after three o'clock, so play did not commence until 3.15. It was settled to commence the game in cloisters, owing to the weather, and the ball was kicked off from the lower end by the Charterhouse captain. After some exciting play, a goal was obtained for the Charterhouse in a general "squash", which was shortly

The game was maintained in the midst of a heavy rain, and under circumstances of ground utterly unfavourable for dribbling purposes..."

F:"...in weather sufficiently unfavourable to deter the most ardent supporter of the game from putting in an appearance. However, despite that rain had fallen without intermission for two hours previous to the hour appointed for the commencement of play, and that it continued during the entire course of the game, the ball was kicked off at half past three o'clock, each club mustering the compliment of eleven representatives. The slippery state of the ground effectively frustrated anything like scientific play , and the game which throughout was of a very uninteresting character, owing to the feeble exhibition of certain of the Upton back players, eventually ended in favour of the Crystal Palace Eleven by three goals to one. The toss was won by the home team, who elected to kick from the upper end, the visitors mustering only ten men, owing to the unexplained desertion of one of their number. For a quarter of an hour after the ball was started, the home eleven had slightly the advantage, pricipally owing to the concentrated play of the School forwards and the brilliant runs of R.W.S.Vidal, who, after several ineffectual attempts, and thanks to a good run-down on the part of W.S.Rawson, succeeded by a rather lucky side kick in landing the ball safely between the posts. With the change of ends the visitors appeared to warm to their work, and assisted by the condition of the ground, which was now all in favour of the heavier team, succeeded in penning their opponents and keeping the School backs well employed. Unsuccessful runs down were made for Upton by H.Compton, H.Wilton, A.M.Jones, and M.Jutsum, but the back play of C.W.Stephenson was too good to allow of any decisive advantage being gained. On one occasion a long run by A.P.Short enabled H.Compton to kick a "poster", but the ball, in rebounding from the post, went outside the coveted space. During these attacks the School team had by no means relaxed their exertions ,and the services of the Upton backs were frequently called into requisition to repel the onslaughts of R.W.S.Vidal, H.B.Dixon, W.S.Rawson, and others. Although both teams worked without any abatement of energy until the call of time, at half past four o'clock, no further score was made, the School thus remaining the victors by one well earned goal. From first to last the game was vey evenly contested, the slight numerical advantage on the part of the Uptonians (F:"the Wanderers taking the field with eight men to their opponents' nine, a number which the home team subsequently increased to ten.") enabling them to resist successfully the frequent attacks of their opponents. Once or twice the Upton goal was placed in imminent danger by the runs of R.W.S.Vidal, and but for the excellent back-play of C.Warner its surrender would have been the inevitable result. But although nearly a dozen(!) had arrived, it took till almost half past 3 before they could make up their minds to face the elemnts in war paint." "It was a very foggy and shady business indeed. Many were the runs upon the bank goal, and many dodges were performed which were anything but straightforward." "Of casualties we regret to state there were a few. Giffard really hurt his foot severely, but though an ambulance stood by (in the shape of a wheelbarrow) he did not avail himself of it."

SM:The first match of the season between these two clubs took place at Charterhouse yesterday (Wednesday), and, after a very pleasant and stiffly-contested contest, resulted in a well-earned victory for the Carthusians by three goals to one. The scene of action was on this occasion Under Green(F:"very narrow, and bounded on one side by a tall boarding"), which, to treat the matter in the mildest manner, was in a condition utterly unfit for play, the centre of the ground being occupied by a circular patch of soft mud, of no mean width, through which it was almost impossible to wade, and by which the spirit of the game greatly suffered.Still, despite this blot the contest proved of the most exciting character throughout, and the play was faster than any we have yet seen this season, the Wanderers , who were a very weighty team from first to last, eventually succumbing to vastly superior organisation, and a display of as good backingup as we have of late witnessed. The Carthusians having won the toss, elected to kick to the Cloister end and soon after the kick off, which took place shortly before three o'clock, the goal occupied by the Wanderers surrendered after a short scrimmage to some good play on the part of the Carthusians collectively, the honour of the final kick being registered to E.F.Brown.After the change of ends the game became still more lively, and once or twice there seemed a chance that the Wanderers (F:"who were vastly too heavy throughout for so small a ground"), by a liberal usage of their superior weight would force the ball through the School goal. It was not, however, until after the lapse of some time that this result was maintained, some judicious manoevres on the part of A.F.Kinnaird enabling A.Borwick by the achievement of a goal to the Wanderers, to place the two sides once more on terms of equality. Once more the change of positions was effected, and the game became fast and furious, several wellexecuted runs of the Wanderers failing entirely, owing to the very effective manner in which J.F.Inglis played back about this period. SM:"The first of the annual matches between these clubs was played on the School ground at Harrow on Saturday last, and as was anticipated from the strength of the visitors, was productive of a more than usually interesting game. The Wanderers were fortunate, although, owing to unavoidable circumstances, one of the most prominent members of their party was prevented at the last moment from putting in an appearance, in being able to muster, perhaps, the best team that they have ever sent to Harrow, and this fact, combined with the general excellence of play shown by them throughout, was mainly due to their success in beating the Harrovians on this occasion(F:"the first victory achieved by the Wanderers on the same ground during the last six years.").At about half past two o'clock, the Harrow captain having won the toss, and thereby gained the advantage of the upper position, the ball was kicked off, the non-arrival of two of the Wanderers at the time of commencement necessitating the transfer of one of the School to their side. During the first ten minutes the Harrovians seemed bent on making their mark without loss of time, as the ball was kept well down in the lower part of the ground, and several shots at the Wanderers' goal only failed through a lack of accuracy in kicking on the part of the besiegers. Gradually settling down, however, the Wanderers steadily drove their opponents back into their own territory, and in their turn succeeded so far as to assume offensive tactics, Crake, Cruikshank, and Vidal being perhaps the most generally in the front on their behalf. For a long time the game continued in this manner without either side being able to lay claim to a decisive advantage, until at last, after a good run up the side of the ground, a catch was given to J.A.Cruikshank, who utilised the chance-one not of the easisiest-so well as to secure, by a well-aimed kick, the first goal for the Wanderers. After the necessary change of ends had been accomplished the latter, with the upper ground, appeared more at home, although so well did the School resist their attacks that some time elapsed before any further score was achieved. Once or twice the forwards of the School almost penetrated into the heart of the enemy's lines, but all their attempts in this quarter were frustrated, and at last , after a general run down of the Wanderers, the ball was judiciuosly "middled" by Q.Hogg to E.Bowen, who, by a truly fine long kick , secured therefrom a second goal for the visitors. The general voice, however being of play, the ball was started by the Brixton captain in a fog so thick that the position of the two goals was a matter of mere guess-work, each side mustering eight representatives at the outset. Despite the darkness that surrounded the whole scene, and formed perhaps the best barrier in defence of the respective goals, almost the first rush proved productive of a score for the Wanderers, C.W.Alcock directing his course to such purpose as to secure a goal for their account, after a run of considerable length. SM:"The annual match between these clubs, usually one of the most stiffly-fought and agreeable contests of the season, was played in the Parks Oxford on Saturday last, under the most favourable combination of circumstances. The weather was sufficiently bright and keen to necessitate hard work on the part of the various players, whilst the ground was in excellent condition, and the fact that the Wanderers on this occasion, by way of a novelty, sent seven of their number from London to aid their detachment at Oxford invested the present match with additional interest. Shortly after three o'clock the ball was set in motion by the captain of the Wanderer, who, having lost the toss, were reduced to occupy the lower goal, with the wind in opposition, and a bright sun shining in their faces. Despite this conjunction of disadvantages, the visitors , by dint of very fast and hard play, drove the ball at the very outset into the quarters of the Oxonians, and several determined attacks were made on their goal, some of which would certainly have taken effect but for the excellent manner in which the defence of their posts was maintained by D.E.Williams(F:"the excellent kicking and effective back play of C.C.Mackarness").Several attempts were made by A.F.Kinnaird, C.E.Nepean, R.S.Vidal, and C.Tait, but for some time none of these met with the desired success, and nothing to favour either party materially occurred, until shortly before half time, when a general rush of the Wanderers, followed by some good play on the part of C.E.Nepean and A.F.Kinnaird, finally culminated in a goal for the Wanderers, the fall of the Oxford fort resulting ultimately from a well-directed kick from the foot of R.W.S.Vidal.Hostilities were resumed without delay, but despite the strenuous efforts of Haigh, Rider, and Barry, for the Oxonians, when half time arrived there had been no success to Oxford to counter-balance that previously achieved by their adversaries. The change of ends now gave the benefits derived from wind and hill to the Wanderers, and with this extraneous assistance, as was anticipated, they kept the Oxonians only still more occupied in defensive movements. Once or twice the latter made desperate rallies ,but as a rule their backing-up was inferior to that shown by the opposition, and many well-conceived and well-executed attempts on the part of several of their forwards failed undoubtedly from the lack of support rendered by the rest of the side. After many unsuccessful endeavours to increase their score the Wanderers were at length enabled, thanks to a good run by C.W.Alcock and A.F.Kinnaird, aided by a final kick from the former, to realise their second goal, the Oxonians meanwhile having failed to register anything in the shape of definite success to their credit. Towards the end of the game the Wanderers, by dint of superior speed, combined with excellent all-round play, increased rather than diminished their hold over their opponents, but although more than one favourable chance was given to some of their side no further score had been secured on their behalf at a quarter past four o'clock, and thus ended an exceedingly pleasant and enjoyable match ..." "The Wanderers..... were very formidably represented, as not only was their London contingent an exceptionally good example of their strength, but in Law, Nepean, and Pelham they possessed three of the most justly celebrated players in the University and owing to Stileman's non-appearance they met with a most valuable ally in Tait, while, on the other hand, the Oxonians were seriously crippled by the absence of +C.F.Woollaston and E.Miller, both of whom were engaged In the athletic sports of their college."

SM:"The first of the two annual matches between the representatives of these two countries ,which have now come to be regarded as the chief events of the season, at least among clubs practising the rules of the Football Assocition, took place at the Oval Kennington on Saturday last, and proved in every way a decided success. The weather, although rather gloomy towards the close, was at the outset clear and fine, and the spectators accordingly mustered in such force as to warrant an estimate of between six and seven hundred, the ground, by the forethought of the management being carefully marked out by a line of ropes. And of the play itself nothing can be said except in terms of the warmest commendation, as throughout the form displayed by all the contestants was up to the highest standard, and the game, although owing to a combination of circumstances, unfavourable to the cause of Scotland, somewhat in favour of the Engish Eleven, was nevertheless

productive of great excitement from first to last. The English captain, it is only fair to state, had been singularly fortunate in being able to muster, perhaps, the very best eleven at his disposal; while, on the other hand, the commander of the Scotch had, in addition to possessing a comparatively small selection of players wherefrom to form a team, had not only been deprived of the valuable service of of Mr W.H.Gladstone, who did such rare service on the last encounter, but at the last moment had his resources still further weakened by the enforced absence of J.F.Inglis, one of the most skilful dribblers, without doubt, on the side of Scotland. With remarkable punctuality the ball was sent on its travels as the church clock gave out the first stroke of three o'clock, the Englishmen, by the success of their captain in the matter of the toss, having elected to occupy the western goal, with the advantage of a slight breeze to assist their efforts. The kick off from the foot of C.E. Nepean for Scotland was followed by an immediate recourse to the most active measures , and so well did the good forward play of the English aid them, at the outset, that the ball was without loss of time driven behind the lines defended by the Scotchmen. Again returned into neutral ground, it remained there for some time, until at last, after the lapse of a quarter of an hour, a good run down by C.W.Alcock resulted in a goal for England from the foot of R.S.F.Walker, to whom the ball had been transferred when within a few yards of the Scottish posts. After this success to the cause of England, positions were reversed, and the Scottish Eleven with the wind in their favour, made a better fight against the constant rushes of the English forwards, amonst whom A.J.Baker, W.B.Paton, and W.P.Crake, were perhaps the most prominent.At one part of the game, indeed, the Scotchmen, mainly by reason of some well-concerted play by A.F.Kinnaird and J.Kilpatrick, appeared likely to recover the goal they had lost, although, owing to the remarkable strength of their adversaries in point of defence, each of their assaults met with a repulse.Meanwhile the English had been maintaining their ground forwards, and on several occasions the rapid runs of A.J.Baker, on whose celerity great reliance seemed to be placed by the spectators, T.C. Hooman and H.J. Preston seemed to render the second surrender of the Scottish fortress imminent. To the untiring energy of C.E. Nepean from first to last, however, it was mainly due that no further success attended the English aims, and although shortly before the close of the game, a side-kick by C.W.Alcock carried the ball within a foot of the opposite posts, when the umpires announced the cessation of hostilities at half past four o'clock the representatives of England remained in possession of the victory by only one goal to none. The territory of the English it may be added, was so well defended by the excellent back play of E.Lubbock, T.N.Carter, and J.Cockerell that the ball was only once kicked off from behind their line, and indeed in the face of so fine a concentration of backs, any success to the Scotch was rendered almost impossible. Every credit, however, is due to the losers for the determined manner in which they struggled to the end, and of all conspicuous mention must be made of the extremely brilliant form shown by C.E.Nepean, who was the saviour of his side; of the good forward play of A.F.Kinnaird, J.Kirkpatrick, and R.E.W.Crawford; of the lavishly displayed charging powers of R.Smith, and of the plucky manner in which Q.Hogg despite that he was so lame as to render the least exertion painful, maintained his post as one of the northern backs. With a slight wind in their favour, the Wanderers, however, were able for some time to keep the ball well away from the vicinity of their line, and at times to maintain an offensive attitude that boded ill for the goal defended by the Crystal Palace. Despite all the efforts of the Wanderers, whose forwards were ably led by A.W.Howard, W.P.Crake, the Hon T.Pelham, and A.Borwick, no direct success had attended their efforts when the arrival of half time necessitated a change of positions. During the latter part of the game the aspect of affairs was perhaps a little more even, the Crystal Palace eleven, mainly by the exertions of A.Lloyd, F.B.Soden, T.F.Spreckley, and W.Bouch, more often than before appoaching the quarters of the Wanderers. In this way the play progressed until within ten minutes of time, when the position of matters was subjected to an alteration very disastrous to the cause of the Palace eleven. The first misfortune that befell them was the downfall of their goal, which was effected by C.W.Alcock, after a brief run and subsequent side kick at a peculiar angle, the ball passing only a few inches on the goalward side of one of the posts. The renewal of hostilities saw a great increase of energy by the representatives of the Crystal Palace, but still further disasters were in store, and just before time an excellent run by A.W.Howard produced the second surrender of the Crystal Palce goal, the Wanderers thus being victorious by two goals."

The visitors, who occupied the goal nearest to the cloisters, despite the wretched state of the ground, and the obstacles caused by the formation of sundry mud pits in the vicinity of the School lines, at once began to open fire on the Carthusian goal which was well defended throughout by the joint efforts of E.V.Ravenshaw(half-back),G.C.Carter(back), and Connell(goals). Several runs by W.P.Crake, P.Weston, and C.J.Morice during the early part of the gameboded ill for the safety of the School fortressut the slippery condition of the ground militated seriously against their success, and

the impossibility of middling the ball or, indeed, dribbling it at any pace, had much to do with the absence of any score to the representatives of Barnes. As the game progessed the aspect of affairs became more even, and so equally were the sides balanced that when play ceased at a quarter past four o'clock, neither party had been able to achieve the downfall of the opposite goal, lthough that of the Carthusians was, on several occasions, placed in serious jeopardy by the excellent play of W.P.Crake and C.J.Chenery, and the fortress defended by Barnes was more than once treated to severe scrimmages in its very front which the slightest stroke of ill-fortune might have rendered fatal. The Carthusians, who were severely crippled by the loss of D.Barry, J.F.Inglis, and G.W.Hervey, as well as the departure of T.P.Gandell at an early stage of the game, were moreover placed at somewhat of a disadvantage at being unable to take advantage of the occasionally weak back play shown by the visitors."

Shortly before three o'clock play commenced with a kick off by the College captain, the Wanderers-who, owing to the very unfavourable aspect of the weather (F:"the contingency of the snow and frost"), not only were very weak in point of those who did represent them, (F:" only five bona fide members of the club put in an appearance, necessitating a recourse to the aid of six auxiliaries")but were moreover compelled to have recourse to several substitutes-occupying the upper(F:"lower") goal with a slight wind at their backs. With this advantage the visitors succeeded in maintaining the offensive during the earlier part of the game, and once or twice, by the runs of C.W.Alcock and C.L.Huggins, seriously threatened the College goal, but with so little success that half time had arrived without a goal to either side. Ends were consequently changed, and the Collegians with the wind to aid their efforts, in their turn were the besiegers, until at last,after a general scrimmage,a goal was placed to their account(F:"a general rush,aided by the rather questionable play of some of the forwards"). Hostilities were resumed without loss of time, and the Wanderers redoubled their efforts as the time drew near for a cessation of play. Still no definite score rewarded their exertions, although many well-directed attempts were only frustrated by the slippery state of the ground in the centre of the College goal, and when the end came at half past four o'clock victory rested with the College by one goal.All credit is due to the victors for the excellent manner in which they played the Association rules, considering that this was only the second occasion on which they had tried them. After a quarter of an hour's delay, during which it was hoped some of the deserters might arrive, both clubs took the field, the sides having been equalised by the Uptonians turning over to their opponents two "reserves" and two men from their team(F:"a transfer of four"). At length at a quarter past three the ball was kicked off by M.Jutsum on behalf of the visitors, West Kent having won the toss and selected the western goal. For the first twenty minutes the game was principally confined to the West Kent quarters, although the back play of Q. Hogg was too good to allow anything tangible from the attacks. Moreover the half-melted snow with which the ground was covered, and which rendered dribbling difficult and running hazardous, proved a most valuable ally for defensive purposes. The weather was very much against the play, as small rain fell at intervals during the course of the game, and the ground moreover was so greasy on the surface from recent downpours as to impede to a great extent the exhibition of individual skill, and to frustrate entirely all attempts at consistent dribbling. Shortly after three o'clock the ball was sent on its travels by the captain of the Wanderers, and the first few minutes sufficed to show the inequality of the contest, the Harrow eleven being placed at a great disadvantage in having to play according to rules with which they were utterly unused. Under these circumstances it is hardly a matter for surprise that the Wanderers had the game entirely in their own hands, the absence of catches so prevalent at Harrow proving somewhat difficult of comprehension to the Rovers' backs. About ten minutes had elapsed when a goal fell to the Wanderers, through the agency of A.F.Kinnaird, and before long a second was achieved by the same player ,followed in due turn by one from the foot of C.J.Chenery, and another by A.W.Howard, the last the result of a fine run and excellent kick. After this an arrangement was made to conclude the match according to Harrow rules, and even at these the Wanderers maintained a decided advantage, although no further goal had been registered to their credit when play ceased at twenty minutes past four o'clock(F:"..a good kick by A.J.Baker once almost securing the fall of the Harrow goal.". The Harrovians hardly played in the form that might have been expected, while the Wanderers, in addition to mustering in great strength, played in better style than they have yet shown this season.A.F.Kinnaird and A.W.Howard (forwards) were most conspicuous, and Q.Hogg was even more than usually efficient at back."

Play was commenced shortly after three o'clock, the Wanderers mustering at the commencement nine to ten of Eton, though the latter were shortly reinforced by another arrival, and their number thus increased to the full complement. From first to last the game was very even, although the contest took place under decided difficulties, the ground being so wet and heavy as to render anything like superior forward play on either side impossible. Once or twice the Wanderers during the early part of the match, appeared on the verge of a score as the ball, owing to the absence of any goalkeeper on the side of the opposition, was on several occasions carried within a few yards of the Eton goal.Nothing had occurred to either party when the bell rang for change of ends at half time, and towards the finish the the game was so strictly even that no decisive success was achieved, the match eventually terminating in a draw., without definite score to either of the contestants, although A.F.Kinnaird during the latter part of the play on a few occasions seriously threatened the Eton lines. The Wanderers, considering that they mustered two less than their opponents, played in very good style, A.F.Kinnaird (forward) rendering himself especially conspicuous, and M.T.Morton and Q.Hogg(back).For the Etonians ,R.H.Benson made himself prominent by several very clever runs and the Hon. H.S.Legge was also very useful by his good kicking back."

combined with the fact that each captain was using every effort to secure the best players at his disposal, invested the preliminaries with more than ordinary interest in the minds of those who support the Football Association, by whose laws the game was governed, and fine weather appeared all that as requisiste to produce an attendance of spectators commensurate with the importance of the match and the reputation of the players engaged. Fine weather, however, there was none, and although the contestants were so far favoured in the absence of rain during the absolute progress of the game, the gloomy aspect of affairs during the morning was by no means reassuring to those who had intended to witness the match, while unquestionably the prospect of occupying a cheerless position for an hour and a half on a ground soaked with an almost incessant downpour of a week prevented hundreds from putting in an appearance who would otherwise have added to the ring of spectators. At three o'clock, with the ground so slippery and heavy as as to be obviously unfavourable for the exhibition of any great individual skill, the ball was kicked off by the captain of the Southerners, the Northerners , at the last moment having to substitute W.E.Rowlinson for C.E.B.Nepean, the loss of the latter being , perhaps, the greatest misfortune of this description that could have befallen them. The absence of any advantage to either side in wind or position caused the play to be very fast, and, indeed, at the outset the ball was driven from end to end with great rapidity, the forwards of the South at the commencement evincing a determination which they sustained until the finish, as well as an amount of organisation that gave them infinite credit. For a long time, with the exception that the Southerners, mainly by reason of the fine play of A.W.Howard and C.J.Chenery on the one side, and W.P.Crake and R.W.S.Vidal on the other, held a slight adavantage, there was little noteworthy in the play, although once M.P.Betts was on the verge of securing a goal for the South, his attack being only frustrated by the excellent defence of the opposing goalkeeper..So matters progressed without definite success to either side, when "half time" arrived ,at a quarter to four o'clock,ends were changed ,the play,indeed, having been more remarkable for general excellence, rather than any feats of individual skill. After this the Northerners, in their turn, by a series of rushes on three occasions imperilled the safety of the enemy's position, once when T.C.Hooman, by a fine kick from the vicinity of the touch-line , drove the ball just over the line that joined the Southern posts; once when C.L.Rothera carried it a few feet to the outside of the same goal; and again when its fall appeared imminent from a short run and subsequent sharp sidekick from the foot of C.W.Alcock.Still, however, the Northerners were kept at bay, and the game had progressed without tangible result to either party until only three minutes remained of the allotted time, when a cleverly-executed run by A.W. Howard along the lower side of the ground , followed by some judicious middling on the part of the same player into the immediate front of the opposite posts, afforded W.P.Crake of an opportunity of securing the downfall of the Northern goal of which he was not slow to take advantage with the aid of a neat kick. Thus in the face of the impossibility of any counter success to the North in the few minutes that were left, the Southerners remained in possession of a victory that was well deserved as it was bravely won. Their play all round was admirable ,their representatives working throughout with unflagging determination, and in remarkable unison..Distinctions would be unjust, so that we shall merely record the excellent conjunction formed, as before stated, by the two layers who defended each of their sides, with a word of praise to C.W.Stephwenson for his back play.On the side of the North, many of whom were strange to the football of the South, J.C. Whelan, of Sheffield, showed good pace, as well as kicking and dribbling powers of no mean order; while E.H.Greenhalgh was also at times very prominent, and A.F.Kinnaird(forward) and Q.Hogg were also very noticeable, the last-named, as usual, exhibiting all his wanting pluck and precision of kicking. "

Alcock at last broke the spell by placing a well-earned goal to the credit of the Wanderers. Ends were changed, and during the rest of the game, which was brought to a close shortly before half past four o'clock, the play showed little superiority of moment to either, although the Wanderers, by their greater skill in dribbling, were able to secure two more goals (F:"..occupying a space of equal duration during the remainder of the game."i.e. a quarter of an hour?)), both of which were achieved by A.F.Kinnaird."

SM:"The return match between these clubs took place at the Oval on Saturday last, and was productive of one of the stiffest contests in which the Wanderers have taken part during the present season. Both sides were well represented, the Wanderers, indeed mustering on this occasion a stronger eleven than any that had done battle for them in 1871. At twenty minutes to three o'clock the ball was kicked off by the Hampstead party, the Wanderers, in winning the toss, deriving at the outset a considerable advantage in the shape of a breeze blowing straight down the ground. By this means the ball was kept well down in the vicinity of the Hampstead posts, where it remained for some time, in spite of the gallant defence of the brothers Tatham, until at last, after a sharp scrimmage in front of the poles, the fall of the Heathens goal was at length accomplished by a smart kick from the foot of Hon.T.Pelham.Ends were changed, and the Wanderers now experienced the full force of the wind, to which they were placed in opposition , to such purpose that for almost a quarter

of an hour, with the exception of an occasional sally, they were utterly unable to raise the siege maintained by their opponents. Twice, indeed, their goal was placed in absolute peril, as once H.J. Lake drove the ball just over the tape, and again it was only preserved from certain overthrow by the brilliant play of W.Wallace who rescued the ball almost on its passage between the posts. In time, however, by increasing exertions, the Wanderers succeeded in reversing the order of things, and the Heathens were steadily driven back to some tune. A good kick by A.G.Bonsor resulted in a "poler" as the ball rebounded into play from one of the posts, while a severe mélée shortly afterwards again threatened the Hampstead lines. Still nothing occurred to increase the score of the Wanderers, and play was continued without material incident until a quarter to four o'clock, when a short run by C.W.Alcock, followed by a clever kick from the same player, realised a second goal for the home eleven. Again positions were reversed, and from this point until the end the Wanderers , once more favoured with the wind, maintained the offensive, though so excellent was the back-play of the Heathens that no third goal had been registered to their account when play ceased , at four o'clock."

SM:"On Saturday last the second of the two annual matches promoted by the committee of the Football Association for decision, according to the laws promulgated by their authority, took place at Kennington Oval. The interest evinced in the contest was manifested in the array of spectators, who mustered in greater force than on the occasion of the first match, when upwards of five hundred were present, and it is generally admitted that they were rewarded by witnessing not only some of the grandest all-round play ,but,moreover,one of the toughest fights that have been seen for many years. Scotland were more favoured in the composition of its representative eleven than in the first encounter as, although the Scotch suffered by the loss of H.Renny-Tailyour, of the Royal Engineers, and R.E.W.Crawford, of Harrow School, in other respects they were strengthened by the co-operation of W.H.Gladstone, who rendered such efficient aid to their cause in 1868, as well as of J.F.Inglis, of Charterhouse School. Moreover, in addition C.E. Primrose and "F.M'Lean", the latter of whom it may be as well to state, under his right name is well known as an athlete of Oxford celebrity, proved by no means an unfair exchange for the two players whose vacancies they were chosen to fill. Punctually, according to announcement, at half past three o'clock the play commenced in weather gloomy overhead, but otherwise most propitious, with a kick off from A.J.Baker on behalf of the English, who had lost the toss, and were in occupation of the goal nearest to the gasworks, towards which a strong breeze was blowing directly down the line of play. The Scottish Eleven (F:"..occupying the western goal")consequently with the extraneous assistance of the wind, as well as by the exhibition of marvellous energy in the play of their forwards, at the commencement maintained a severe fire on the lines of the English, and finally with such success that after about the lapse of a quarter of an hour a goal was accredited to their cause by some very clever play on the part of C.E.B.Nepean.Positions were now reversed, and the game commnced to assume a more even aspect, as the tactics of the Scottish captain in strengthening his defence in order to maintain the success that had fallen to his side, were to a great extent neutralised by the now adverse wind, as well as by the now visible increase in determination among the English forwards.Twice,indeed,the Scotch fortress was only saved by the timely obstruction of the goalkeeper, and once in addition an appeal was raised by the English on the score of illegal handling, as the ball was apparently on its passage between the Scottish posts. For a long time, however, so undeviating had been the resistance of Q.Hogg and W.H.Gladstone, and so unerring the kicking of both, that more than half an hour of fighting had followed the downfall of the English lines before a similar disaster befel the opposition in the achievement of a goal for England(F:" after the lapse of almost an hour from the commencement of the game") by R.S.F.Walker ,by an extremely clever and well-directed kick. Another change of positions was rendered necessary by this second event, and from this period until the end, although each goal was on more than one occasion seriously imperilled, a slight advantage rested with the English, who during the last ten minutes kept the ball unpleasantly close to the inner lines of the Scotch, and once, indeed, approached so close to the posts defended by the northerners as to cause some predictions of the ultimate victory of England. Five o'clock , however, came without having permitted either eleven to increase their previous score of one goal, and thus ended in a "draw" the most spirited, as well as the most pleasanly-contested , match that has ever been seen on the Surrey Cricket Ground. The play, indeed, was so consistently good, and the followingup so hard, that not one run of any length occurred during the game, and consequently the forwards in many instances apparently failed to sustain the reputation they have gained. On both sides the backs exhibited faultless play, as well as remarkable precision of kicking, W.H.Gladstone, Q.Hogg, and E.Lubbock all meriting favourable notice , though those unmentioned also performed their duties efficiently. The game throughout was maintained without a hitch, and afforded great satisfaction to

the partisans of both sides, notwithstanding that , if we can believe a recent protest, the rules of the Football Association do not represent the national laws of the game in Scotland, (BL:"...though many of their representatives are well known metropoitan players.") and A.K.Smith and F.M'Lean proved weighty assistants to the same side. At three o'clock the captain of the School set the ball in motion, the Carthusians, who had won the toss, kicking towards the cloisters. At first the Wanderers, who were represented by a comparatively feeble team, were assisted by three substitutes, but two more members shortly put in an appearance, and, with the aid of one valuable emergency lent by the School, they thus continued until the last quarter of an hour, when the departure of E.Field reduced their number to ten. With the advantage of weight the Wanderers soon drove the boys back, and after about a quarter of an hour of hard fighting a goal was secured by H.P.Stevens, after some good play in concert with R.B.Cotton, but the plea of "off-side" being raised by the School the claim was relinquished. Soon afterwards, however, a goal was achieved by Hon. T.Pelham, and the change of ends was speedily followed by a similar success for the Carthusians. After this second score the game progressed for a short time without incident worthy of note, until after a short time the Wanderers were gazetted with a second goal through the agency of C.W.Alcock. This advantage they succeeded in maintaining until about ten minutes before the call of time, when a well-executed run down was effected by the Carthusians, and the ball was again steered between the posts of the Wanderers goal, though not without a general protest against the legality of the score ,on the ground of an evident infringement of the offside rule. During the few minutes that remained neither side was exposed to any danger, and thus, at a quarter past four, the match ended in a tie, each eleven having secured two goals."

F:"..the centre of the ground, which, possibly for the purpose as a definite line of demarcation between the two parties, was ornamented by a tastefully-arrnged composition of crushed bricks and compressed brick dust, bounded on two extremities by a cleverly-devised arrangement of tan of sufficient substance to render a fall pleasant by contrast with the effects of a similar disaster on the central portion of the ground. The Wanderers were represented by a very poor sample of their strength, but notwithstanding, their superior weight enabled them to achieve the first goal, for which they were indebted to a kick by Hon *F.H.Pelham, one that had previously been secured by the joint efforts of R.B.Cotton and H.F.Stephens having been disputed by the School, on the score that the latter player was offside, and consequently relinquished. Afrer a general scrimmage in front of the posts, the ball was next forced through the Wanderers' posts, but again only a short time elapsed before the latter were once more able to assume the lead by means of a second goal credited to them by C.W.Alcock after a short run.Until the last guarter of an hour the game remained in this positionm, when a general rush of the School again menaced the Wanderers' lines, and, after some questionable play, the ball was ultimately driven into the centre of the goal, a total collapse of the posts and cord being threatened by the eagerness of a Carthusian determined to render success more certain by clasping firmly one of the visitors' poles. To this second achievement of the School an objection was raised by the Wanderers; but as there appeared no sign on the part of the Carthusian captain to concede the point, the game proceeded, ending ultimately in a tie, with two goals on each side." *T.Pelham

The weather was evidently more suited to the pursuit of cricket than football, but still, despite the obvious impossibility of playing up with any great amount of energy under the influence of so scorching a sun, the game was interesting and well-contested from first to last. The Wanderers boasted their full strength, as will be seen from their list of representatives, while the eleven that did battle for the World, on the other hand, was proportionately weak, having been from sundry circumstances deprived of the services of several players of repute who had promissed to assist their cause(see the proposed lineup in Field 18/3/71 P.222).At twenty minutes to four o'clock the ball was kicked off by the captain of the Wanderers, who thus commenced under the disadvantage of facing the dazzling sun. Soon the ball was carried down into the quarters occupied by the Wanderers, and was at last safely landed between the posts by R.S.F.Walker, but the goal was not allowed in consequence of his infringement of the off-side rule, and the game continued. The Wanderers, now working well together commenced a persistent series of attacks on the adverse goal, which was only saved on several occasions by the excellent play of the two backs, S.R.Tatham and W.S.Rawson.At last, however, a well-executed run down the lower side of the ground by T.C.Hooman, followed by some excellent play on the part of W.Crake and A.W.H.Howard, produced the fall of the goal occupied by the World, the final kick being administered by the last-named player. After the change of ends the game showed little difference in its general aspect, and for some little time nothing occurred worthy of record, with the exception of an occasional dashing run by R.S.Walker. The Wanderers had succeeded in maintaining their lead until half past four o'clock, when a neat run by H.B.Dixon resulted in the collapse of the Wanderers'

goal to the evident surprise of that portion of spectators in its immediate neighbourhood. From this point till the call of time at five o'clock the Wanderers ,though they appeared on the verge of another score on several occasions, failed to add to their previous success, and thus the match ended in a tie, with one goal to each side."
